

11th Annual General Meeting

Held at 2pm on 03 July 2016 at Freie Universität Berlin, Germany

The following business was transacted:

1. Welcome

The AGM had a quorum of 70 members, 20 being the required number.

2. Apologies for absence

Postgraduate liaison officer David O'Reilly was not present.

3. Minutes of the previous meeting (AGM10)

Agreed.

4. Matters arising

5. Annual Report, Officer Reports and accounts 2015-16

a. The Chair (Andreas Musolff)

The chair reported a healthy development of membership numbers, especially with respect to the increase in student members and Early Career Researchers. The number Facebook followers has also increased. RaAM's finances are promising, leading to possibilities for seed-corn funding and for support for prizes for papers at RaAM-endorsed events. The chair also noted an increase in number of proposals for workshops and conferences as well as of RaAM-endorsed events.

b. The Treasurer (Alice Deignan)

The treasurer reported an income of £2993.90 in the period from 05 April 2015 – p4 April 2016. Expenditures during this same period of time amounted to £1859.39; expenses included website hosting and domain name, RaAM insurance, EC costs Leiden June 2015, EC costs Amsterdam February 2016, PhD party Leiden, Bursury for Leiden seminar, and bank charges. The total amount in the RaAM bank accounts as of 04 April 2016 was £10582.77. Reserves amount to £5033.98. Alice explained that there is a peak income point in the a two-year cycle resulting from biennial conferences/seminars. The EC will make a decision about seedcorn funding and publicize it through the webpage and emails to members.

c. The Web Editor (Gudrun Reijnierse)

The web editor reported on the number of unique visitors who have accessed the RaAM website, showing a peak in May 2016. She also reported on the following additions to the website: creation (improvement) of the online voting system, updated Berlin conference information, the publishing of newsletter number 18, and an updated RaAM endorsed events page.

d. The Conference Secretary (Lettie Dorst)

The conference secretary reported the following about the Leiden seminar in 2015: There were 63 submissions, with 25 papers, 14 posters, and 3 plenary sessions. Nine workshops were held; 3 post-plenary workshops, 3 communicative domains workshops, and 3 tools and methods workshops. Two student bursaries were awarded, one by the LOC and one by RaAM. A PhD event was sponsored with €200, and a final profit of €1000 was transferred to RaAM.

Lettie reported the following about the Berlin 2016 conference: There were 19 people at the pre-conference workshop (11 students). For the conference, there were 295 abstracts, with 129 papers, 4 posters, 4 themed sessions and 5 plenaries. 121 people attended the conference. There were 21 applications for student bursaries (20 funded) and 14 applications for non-student bursaries (all funded). A PhD event was sponsored by €250. In addition, there was an art exhibition (Lynne Cameron), film screening, opening reception, conference dinner, Cinepoetics reception, and a party.

The next RaAM seminar will be held in 2017 at the University of Southern Denmark (Thomas Wibben Jensen is responsible). The next conference will be held in 2018 at Hong Kong Polytechnic University (Dennis Tay responsible). The bid for the 2019 seminar will go out in 2019.

e. The Postgraduate Liaison & Development Officer (Andreas Musolff for David O'Reilly)

The postgraduate liaison and development officer was not present at the AGM, but had sent in information that was reported in his absence. The Facebook group has been active over the past year giving updates from the postgraduate liaison, information about conferences and PhD scholarships, Open Access articles, discussion, etc. David encourages all students to engage with RaAM through the RaAM student directory and the METAPHOR column (and RaAM newsletter).

f. Newsletter Editor (Tina Krennmayr)

The newsletter editor reports that three newsletters have been published over the past year: No. 16 (May 2015; downloaded 137 times), No. 17 (October 2015; downloaded 250 times) and No. 18 (June 2016). There are all available online. A new feature of the newsletter is the Metaphor Column. Tina encourages everyone to contribute to the newsletter.

6. Election results

Elections were held for the posts of Treasurer, Conference secretary, Postgraduate liaison, Newsletter editor, Web editor, and two Ordinary members.

The 2016 elections were electronic only, closing at midnight on July 2. All RaAM members were sent a link to the election page. An email reminder was sent out to all members on July 1. 64 RaAM members cast their vote (cp. 47 valid votes in 2014).

8. Any other business

The Early Career Prize, PhD prize and Poster prize were announced at closing statement of the conference.

The Early Career Research Paper Prize was awarded to Dr. Weiwei Zhang, for her paper Zhang, W., D. Geeraerts & D. Speelman (2015) Visualizing onomasiological change: Diachronic variation in metonymic patterns for WOMAN in Chinese. *Cognitive*

Linguistics 26:2, 289–330. The winner was chosen by a jury comprising Gill Philip (co-ordinator), Albert Katz, and Marc Alexander. This prize was sponsored by RaAM.

The PhD Presentation Prize was won by Mateo Fuoli for his work analyzing the pictorial and multimodal metaphors used by participants in the ‘Behind the logo’ rebranding competition launched online by Greenpeace in the aftermath of BP’s Gulf of Mexico oil spill of 2010. This prize was sponsored by De Gruyter in the form of a EUR 300 book voucher.

The RaAM Poster Prize was won by Charlotte Hommerberg and Anna Gustafsson for their poster entitled “Metaphors in palliative cancer care (MEPAC)”. This prize was sponsored by John Benjamins.
